'Kutiyattam - A Masterpiece of Oral Heritage - Sanskrit Theatre' by actors from Kutiyattam Kendra Kerala at Uttara Guruvayoorappan Temple, Mayur Vihar Phase 1
The only surviving Sanskrit theatre tradition from the 6th century

'Dancing to The Gods - Nata-Sankirtan & Vasant Raas'
by artistes from Manipur Dance Academy at Birla Mandir (Mandir Marg)

'Sufi Qawwali' by Chand Nizami at Nizamuddin Dargah
Sufi devotional music in the dargah of Delhi's world famous Sufi saint

Saturday 28th 12.30 pm

'Hymns of Guru Gobind Singh' by Ragis Baljeet Singh and Gurmeet Singh Namdhari at Dumdama Sahib Gurudwara (behind Humayun's Tomb)
Rarely sung hymns of the 10th Guru of the Sikhs at the site of his visit in the early 1700s
